Information for the Day:

The annual Huntley School Golf Day will be held at the Marton Golf Course on Sunday 18th September 2011. It is the major fund raising event for the Parents & Friends of Huntley and a day that the whole Huntley community is encouraged to participate in. This year all funds raised on the day will be used to refurbish the tennis courts. The emphasis for the Golf Day is on having fun and the day provides a great opportunity for the Huntley community to come together and enjoy some golf.

We have a large field of golfers so please try and arrive on time at 9.00am.

We thank the many businesses, organizations, families and individuals who have provided sponsorship and donated prizes towards this day. We also thank the many parents and friends who have volunteered to help prior to, and on the day.

Master of Ceremonies: Mr Guy Lennox

Lunch: Please provide a plate of finger food for a shared lunch. As heating facilities are limited you are asked to bring cold food eg sandwiches, slices and muffins. The Golf Club bar is open when the field returns to the clubhouse.

BBQ: There will be two BBQs. One will be located on the 6th hole and the other will be near the Clubhouse. Refreshments will also be available at the 6th Hole.

Clubhouse Carvery: Carvery ham sandwiches will be available outside the clubhouse from 11.00am.

Scatter Ball

This year there will be a first and second prize for Scatterball. Rangitikei Helicopters Ltd has kindly offered to drop up to 1000 table tennis balls onto the 18th green. The numbered ball closest to the hole will win a fantastic Ninja Scooter kindly part sponsored by The Bike Shed. The Loudon Family has generously donated a helmet to accompany this prize.

The list of numbers that have been allocated to you will be at the clubhouse so check your numbers. You will still be able to buy table tennis balls up until 1.00 pm on the day if you have missed out and these will cost \$5.00 per ball.

In the case where more than one ball is in the hole a draw will be done.

Activities around the Clubhouse

Activities around the clubhouse will start once the players have returned from the course from approximately 12.30pm onwards.

Golf Day activities will include:

Paintball: Courtesy of Hunting and Fishing Manawatu. For everyone to try their skills at hitting targets

Putting Competition: Test your skills on the putting green.

Putt for Dollars: Putt and land on the money to keep the note.

Coconut Shy: Throw balls at the coconuts to knock them off and win a small prize.

PFH Stall: Parents' and Friends' of Huntley Stall will be at Golf Day. This will have the Taste Huntley Cook Book and new Huntley merchandise for sale.

Huntley Boys' Wii Golf

This year Wii Golf has been completed prior to Golf Day due to time restraints. This was open to Huntley Boys only. The boys tested their virtual golfing skills against the challenging holes Wii provides. Play was over three holes of Wii. Each boy entered got a "total score" and was timed to complete the holes. The winner was the boy with the lowest total score and in the shortest time if there was more than one boy on that score.

Final dates to complete your Wii Golf are: Tuesday 13th September at 3.30 pm in the Rec Room and a back-up day of Saturday 17th September at 2.00 pm.

Coffee: Coffee and biscuits will be available in the Clubhouse near the kitchen courtesy of **(s)nAn's'**

Kitchen: Please take your food to the kitchen when you arrive so that the team working there can organize the shared lunch. Lunch will be available at 12.30 pm and 1.30 pm approximately for the later golfers.

Payments: There will be no school EFTPOS onsite so it is necessary to bring some cash. **Items cannot be charged to your Incidental Account.** Cash and cheques will be accepted and large items won at the auction can be invoiced to you by the PFH. There will be a form to fill out indicating choice of payment.

Transport: Tranzit Manawatu Ltd, one of our principal sponsors will transport the boarders to and from the Marton Golf course on the day. Please meet your sons at the course. Day boys will come with their parents.

Postponement: The Golf Day will only be postponed in the case of extreme weather conditions or if the course is closed. A text will be sent to you from the school if this occurs. Cellphone coverage at the Marton course is marginal.

Medical: There will be a first aid kit and a defibrillator located at the Clubhouse.



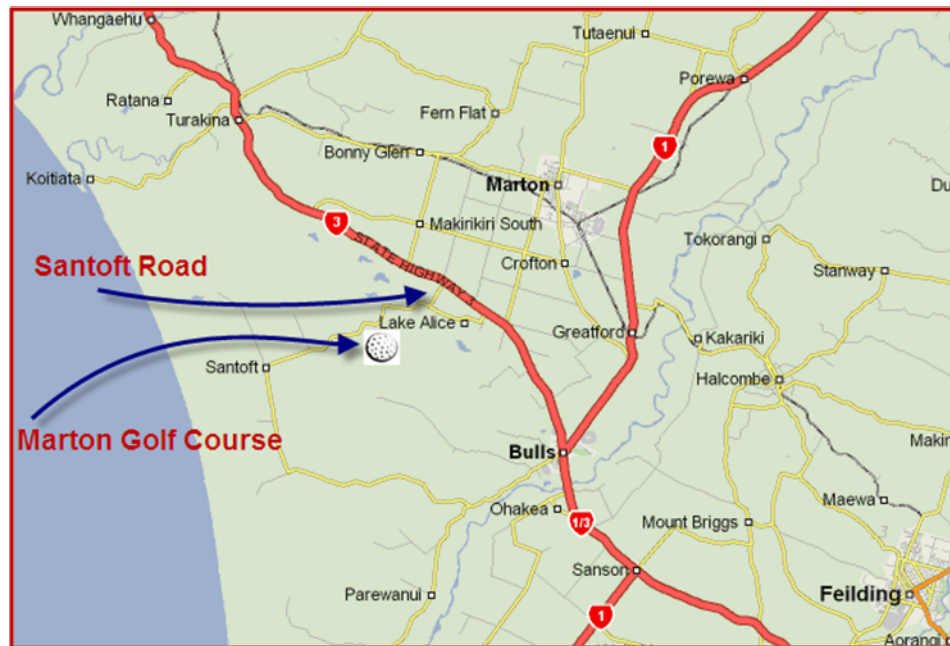
How to get to the Marton Golf Club

Situated 5 km down Santoft Road which is 9 km north of Bulls on State Highway 3 (ie. the Bulls-to-Wanganui road).

Watch for the Marton Golf Club sign and a Huntley School Golf Day sign erected at the turn-off on SH3.

Rules and Etiquette

Just a few general rules to help you if you are not sure.

Safety:

Do not stand too close to the player making a stroke.

Undue Delay:

Where ever possible prepare to play your next stroke while others are playing; it just helps to speed up play.

Bunkers:

If you get into a bunker after playing your shot carefully rake where you have played. Please leave the rake inside the bunker and in a position that will least likely affect play for following golfers.

Replace Divots: Anywhere on the course; a player should ensure that any turf cut or displaced is replaced and pressed down.

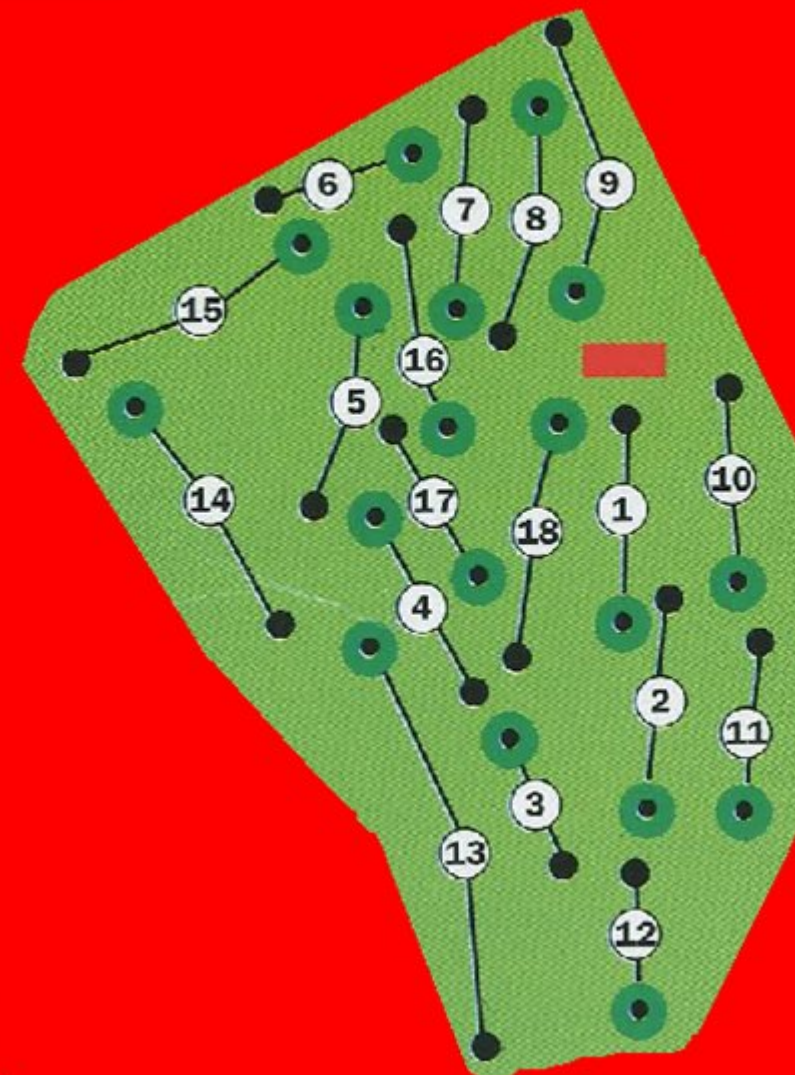
Repair Ball Marks: Any damage caused by balls landing on the green should be leveled with a pitch mark reparer or tee peg and then tapped down with the putter.

Greens and Flagsticks: Do not lean on a putter or flagstick. Flagsticks should be properly replaced in the hole before the players leave the green. Do not cause damage to the greens by dragging your shoes or objects. Trundlers are not to be taken onto the greens and are to be left to the side.

General: Please pick up any rubbish and put it in bins around the course or bring it back to the clubhouse with you. These rules apply to the practice areas around the Clubhouse also.

4+ Hole Non-Golfers will play holes 3, 4, 17, 18. Play is Canadian foursome format where both players tee off from the yellow tees. Select the best ball per pair and then play alternate shots of this ball until the hole is finished (eg. If you use the adult's tee shot, the boy plays the second shot and vice versa). Placing is allowed on our own fairway only. Don't forget to add up your total gross score and hand in your completed scorecard on arrival back at the Clubhouse. Note that two 4+ hole groups will have to walk (or play) holes 1 and 2 to get into the shotgun start field but don't enter these hole scores on your card if you decide to play them. Hole 3 is nearest-the-pin (men, ladies, boys) and hole 18 is the longest drive (men - use white tees for this one, ladies, boys). Hole 4 is the 'croquet golf' hole where after both teeing off and then selecting and playing your best ball, you must putt or chip it through the four croquet hoops numbered 1 – 4 (in numerical order) that are situated between the blue 190m fairway marker and the white 137m fairway marker. After you have negotiated the croquet hoops, continue playing until you have finished the hole. Don't forget to take alternate shots after teeing off and count all of your shots - maybe tally this one as you go! Hole 17 is the 'putting only' hole where you can use only your putter to get from tee-to-green. Both tee off using your putter, select the best ball and then putt alternate shots until you have finished the hole. Count all of your putts. After you have completed your holes, you are welcome to have a shot at the 6th tee Huggle Hole where you can double your money by landing on the green.

The course



Golf Day Details

There are 3 golfing categories (see below) and the holes you are playing will be indicated on your score card. Please check the draw for which category and holes you are playing and then carefully read the relevant section below so you will know what to do on the day.

12 Hole Golfers will play holes 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 twice. Play is alternate shots of one ball per pair. Adults tee off even holes and boys tee off odd holes for the first round of 6 holes and then swap over for the second round of 6 holes with boys teeing off even holes and adults teeing off odd holes. Your card will explain this clearly for each of the 12 holes you will play. Placing is allowed on our own fairway only. Don't forget to add up your total gross score and hand in your completed scorecard on arrival back at the clubhouse

After you have played the 15th each time you are welcome to have a shot at the 6th tee Haggie Hole where you can double your money by landing on the green. With no need to putt out, you can just collect your winnings and head straight off to the 10th tee to continue your round.

During your first round, hole 12 is nearest-the-pin for men and ladies and hole 13 is the longest drive for boys. During your second round, hole 12 is nearest-the-pin from an 80m temporary tee for boys and hole 13 is the longest drive for men and ladies.



6 Hole Golfers Group 1 will play holes 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 16. Play is Canadian foursome format where both players tee off (men from white tees and ladies and boys from yellow tees). Select the best ball per pair and then play alternate shots of this ball until the hole is finished (eg. If you use the adult's tee shot, the boy plays the second shot and vice versa). Placing is allowed on our own fairway only. Don't forget to add up your total gross score and hand in your completed scorecard on arrival back at the clubhouse.

Hole 5 is the longest drive (men, ladies, boys) and hole 6 is nearest-the-pin (men, ladies, boys) and the Haggie Hole where you can double your money by landing on the green.

6 Hole Golfers Group 2 will play holes 1, 2, 3, 4, 17, 18. Play is Canadian foursome format where both players tee off (men from white tees and ladies and boys from yellow tees). Select the best ball per pair and then play alternate shots of this ball until the hole is finished (eg. If you use the adult's tee shot, the boy plays the second shot and vice versa). Placing is allowed on our own fairway only. Don't forget to add up your total gross score and hand in your completed scorecard on arrival back at the clubhouse.

Hole 3 is nearest-the-pin (men, ladies, boys) and hole 18 is the longest drive (men, ladies, boys). The croquet hoops on the 4th fairway are for the 4+ hole non-golfers only so you can take a free drop if your ball is near a hoop. After you have completed your round, you are welcome to have a shot at the 6th tee Haggie Hole where you can double your money by landing on the green.
